Students should list AICE Thinking Skills and AICE General Paper as their first and second elective choices in the boxes above. There are no set pre-requisites, however Newsome High School highly recommends a background in Algebra 1 for AICE Thinking Skills and a minimum of Level 2 Reading for AICE General Paper.
