Curriculum

- Engages students through a series of career exploration courses.
- All courses emphasize strengthening literacy, project management, leadership, and team building skills
- NAF launched the Academy of Information Technology (AOIT) in 12 high schools, with support from AT&T, Alcatel-Lucent, Verizon, Hewlett-Packard Company, Oracle Corporation, and United Technologies Corporation. Since then, the theme has grown to serve 112,415 students in 604 academies across 35 states and D.C. in the 2022-2023 school year
- Academy students will have completed four courses and a paid internship by graduation that enhance college and career readiness.
