To enroll in Kindergarten, your child must turn 5 on or before September 1, 2024

Here are the simple steps to enroll:

Step 1: Find Your School

Are you wondering what "kindergarten schools are near me?" If so, use the **School Locator** to find your child's attendance area school. Hillsborough County Public Schools also offer many Choice and Magnet school options for kindergarten registration. Find out more about our Choice and Magnet Programs at **www.HillsboroughSchools.org/Magnet** and **www.HillsboroughSchools.org/Choice** or contact the Choice Information Line at 813-272-4692.

Step 2: Contact Your School

When does kindergarten registration start? **Call your school** A and find a good time to register your child, and learn about school open houses and tours. The child's legal parent or guardian must be there to register the child. You will also need specific documentation in order to register your child for kindergarten.



Step 3: Fill out all Documentation

View a list of **enrollment documents** that you will need to provide or will be asked to complete at the school site for kindergarten registration. Remember, your child's kindergarten registration is not complete until all the documentation is filled out and completed. This can sometimes be a lengthy process. That's why it's important to get started on the kindergarten registration process as soon as possible.

Thank you for choosing to have your child attend a Hillsborough County Public School. We look forward to serving you and your child throughout the upcoming \(\text{24-25} \) school year.

Documents and information provided in this packet are designed to help you <u>prepare</u> for registration. You may complete the two included forms ahead of time and bring with you when you enroll your child.

Please note that registration is not complete until all paperwork is accepted at the school site.

A parent/legal guardian must complete the registration process and provide the proper documents to the school site where the child will attend.

Please refer to the Registration Checklist to double check that you have what you need.

Forms to Complete: (provided)

- SER Student Enrollment Record Form (provided at the school site)
- Student Residency Form can be completed ahead of time, supporting documentation is required (see Registration Checklist for acceptable documents)

Documentation to Provide:

- · Birth Certificate/Proof of Birth
 - Authenticated birth date can be verified by one of the following:
 - -Certified copy of birth certificate/State of Florida Birth Registration Card
 - -Baptismal certificate showing date of birth, place of baptism, accompanied by parents' sworn affidavit
 - Insurance policy on the child in force for at least two years
 - -Bible record of child's birth accompanied by parents' sworn affidavit
 - Passport or certificate of arrival in the United States showing age of child (view only, do not copy)
 - -School record at least four years prior, showing date of birth
- Social Security Number *not a requirement but highly recommended
 - Used as a unique numeric identification for state reporting to the Department of Education.

Physical

Proof of physical examination by an approved licensed health care provider or the Hillsborough County Health Department, within 12 months prior to entry in Florida Schools (first day of school); Contact School Health Services for help.

- > Receive homework in English and in Spanish










Uniforms








Registration Requirements

You MUST have all of the following for your registration to be complete:

- Child must be 5 on or before September 1st, 2023
- Original Birth Certificate
- Social Security Card
- Current Physical (within 1 year of first day of school) with Shot Record
- 2 Proofs of Address

Ready for Kindergarten

This quick information can be used as a guide as you help prepare your child for kindergarten success and beyond. This list contains suggested skills or abilities, but should not be considered fully comprehensive of all possible skills and abilities a five-year-old child should possess.



- Demonstrates physical play, direction and spatial awareness (e.g., running, jumping, balancing, riding a tricycle)
- Eats and drinks without assistance
- Attends to personal hygiene



Social and Emotional Development

- Recognizes and responds with compassion when peers are upset
- Can communicate feelings and emotions
- Has positive relationships with peers and adults
- Plays well with others
- Can problem solve with peers and adults
- Can describe personal characteristics (e.g., hair color, age, gender)



Creative Expression Through the Arts

- Enjoys participating in musical activities (e.g., dance, singing, planning instruments)
- Uses drawing, painting, or other form of art to express thoughts, feelings, and experiences.

Ready for Kindergarten





Social Studies

- Identifies themselves as an individual and how they are different from others
- Understands the use of rules within the family and classroom
- Understands the use of geographic resources (e.g., globes, maps or GPS)
- Understands the role of community workers



- Demonstrates curiosity, eagerness and persistence to a task
- Shows creativity, inventiveness, reflection and planning for a new task







- Communicates clearly with peers and adults
- Listens for personal understanding
- Follows two-step directions
- Speaks clearly, in complete sentences
- Continually increasing the understanding and use of new vocabulary words
- Uses age-appropriate grammar (e.g., possessive pronouns, plurals, past tense)
- Continually uses extended sentences
- Ask and answers questions
- Enjoys looking at and reading books, both independently and with others
- Understands how to care for a book
- Can retell a story
- Can identify letters
- Can separate compound words into two separate words
- Can combine two words to create a new compound word
- Can separate or combine syllables and words
- Names most letters (upper case and lower case)
- Can write own name





- Recognized sets of objects without counting (subitizing)
- Counts to 31
- Manipulates sets (counting objects, separating and combining sets)
- Creates simple patterns using different objects
- Can identify, describe and create basic shapes (circle, square, rectangle and triangle)
- Uses terms such as besides, below, next to, behind and under to describe the location of an object



- Identifies and utilizes all five senses
- Uses various technologies to support exploration and learning
- Understands the difference between and observes living things and non-living things
- Makes predictions about how an environment can change an object (e.g., water, wind, temperature)

What is Expected from You!

- Encourage positive behavior
- Create independence
- Review agendas/daily work together
- Read with or to your child every night
- Complete on-line volunteer application if volunteering at school
- Make sure the teacher knows how your child will be going home (bus, car, walking, private provider van) and notify the office and teacher of any changes in writing
- Make sure the office has your current phone numbers, address, emergency contact, and email address
- Have your child arrive at school on time
 - School begins at 7:40am
 - Mondays Early Release Dismissal 12:55pm
 - Tuesday Friday Dismissal 1:55pm





Summer VPK Program

- > FREE Summer program to ensure kindergarten readiness (dates and times to be determined)
- > Registration requirements: proof of birth, proof of residence and an immunization record
- > Registration at open summer VPK sites (HCPS website)
- > Child must be eligible to start kindergarten August 2024 (5 by September 1, 2024)
- > Child may not have attended a school-year VPK Program
