



Dress Code Policy

- No hats or head coverings, including jacket hoods.
- No apparel which reveals the back or midriff areas.
- No rips, tears, holes, patches or frays in any pants, shorts and skirts.
- Hemlines shall be no shorter than fingertip length.
- No saggy bottoms or visible undergarments.
- No sleeveless or shoulder less tops. Three finger rule.
- No pajamas or blankets.
- No see-through wear.
- No offensive or inappropriate wear.
- Shoes must have a support strap to connect the shoe to the foot. Closed toe sneakers or other closed toe shoes are recommended. During Physical Education classes, shoes must be suitable and safe for indoor & outdoor activities.
- No skate shoes, slippers, slides, etc.
- A jacket may not be used to correct dress code violations.
- Dress and grooming are to be non-disruptive of the educational activities and processes of the school.

Dress Code Checks and Consequences

- Morning announcement 1st period – Campus wide dress code check
– Students out of dress code will be gathered on the patio, checked by staff, and taken to student services or in school suspension.
- Once checked at the beginning of 1st period – The student is sent back to class if found to be in appropriate dress.
- If a student can correct their dress code immediately, they will serve a minimum of one period in ISS.
- Students may call home for a delivery of proper clothing to school. Once the dress code is corrected the student may report to class.
- Dress code checks can occur throughout the day and all dress code checks will be documented, and a phone call home will be made by the grade level counselor or student services.
